SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY PROFILE

Glen Allen High School is the newest high school in Henrico County. Centrally located, Glen Allen High School opened Sept. 7, 2010. The school is comprised of approximately 1,730 students and 150 staff members. Students at Glen Allen also enjoy opportunities available at HCPS' two Advanced Career Education Centers.

ACADEMIC CHARACTERISTICS

The school year is divided into two semesters. A semester is 18 weeks with two nine week reporting periods. Seven classes meet every Monday for 45 minutes and for 90 minutes on alternating days. In addition to the seven classes, there is a shorter study/activity period. The curriculum offers a variety of college-prep, Advanced Placement and honors courses as well as a variety of electives in business, marketing, family and consumer sciences, technology education, fine arts and the general academic areas.

Specialty Center: Center for Education and Human Development

The Center for Education and Human Development is located at Glen Allen High School. This rigorous four-year program is designed for students who aspire to be educators or pursue other leadership opportunities.

GPA and CLASS RANKING

Class rank and grade point average are determined by the levels of courses taken and the grades earned in those courses. Grades earned in courses completed in middle school that were awarded a high school credit will not be computed as part of the high school cumulative GPA. High school courses completed during the summer before entering ninth grade will be included in the GPA. Students are ranked numerically in ascending order, according to GPA, at the end of the junior year and at the end of first semester of the senior year. Students who are earning either a Standard or an Advanced Studies diploma are included in class rank. Beginning with the class of 2017, total grade points include an additional 0.5 quality point for any Honors and a 1.0 quality point for any AP/dual-enrollment class taken.
