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SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY PROFILE

Henrico High School is one of nine high schools in Henrico County. The school is centrally located and serves about 1,600 students with a faculty of approximately 150 teachers. Henrico High School offers two specialty centers - the Center for the Arts (CFA) and the International Baccalaureate Program (IB). Students at Henrico also enjoy opportunities available at HCPS' two Advanced Career Education Centers.

ACADEMIC CHARACTERISTICS

The school year is divided into two semesters. A semester is 18 weeks with two nine-week reporting periods. Seven classes meet every Monday for 45 minutes and for 90 minutes on alternating days. In addition to the seven classes, there is a shorter study/activity period. The curriculum offers a variety of college-prep, Advanced Placement, and honors courses as well as a variety of electives in business, marketing, family and consumer sciences, technology education, fine arts and the general academic areas.

Specialty Center: Center for Fine Arts

The Center for the Arts is by application and audition. The center offers instruction in dance, theatre, visual arts and musical theatre. During a four-year course of study, students will receive instruction in all the core subject areas listed above, with other classes added based on student needs and the availability of qualified guest instructors. Two credits are earned each year with successful completion of arts classes. Students in all four levels in all curriculum areas earn honors-weighted credits.

Specialty Center: Center for International Baccalaureate

The IB Program is by application also and includes the International Baccalaureate Middle Years Program (IBMYP) for students in grades 9 and 10, and the International Baccalaureate Diploma Program for students in grades 11 and 12. Successful completion of the IB diploma in grade 12 earns students advanced placement status at many colleges and universities throughout the world.

GPA and CLASS RANKING

Class rank and grade point average are determined by the levels of courses taken and the grades earned in those courses. Grades earned in courses completed in middle school that were awarded a high school credit will not be computed as part of the high school cumulative GPA. High school courses completed during the summer before entering ninth grade will be included in the GPA. Students are ranked numerically in ascending order, according to GPA, at the end of the junior year and at the end of first semester of the senior year. Students who are earning either a Standard or an Advanced Studies diploma are included in class rank. Beginning with the class of 2017, total grade points include an additional 0.5 quality point for any honors/IBMYP and a 1.0 quality point for any AP/IBDP/dual-enrollment class taken.
