## 2020-2021 SCHOOL PROFILE

### SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Brookland is located in the middle of Henrico County. It was built in 1958 and renovated in 2012. Situated on 33 acres, there are 13 buildings including seven classroom buildings, a gym and activities building, a library, three cafeterias, and an administration building.

### ACADEMIC SCHOOL CHARACTERISTICS:

Brookland Middle School operates on a Day 1 / Day 2 schedule with an advisory period everyday. Students will attend periods 1-4 on Day 1 and will attend periods 5-8 on Day 2. Students have four 80 minute classes per day. The day begins at 8:35 am and ends at 3:15 pm. Numerous instructional levels are offered in each academic course. Instructional levels include, but are not limited to Exceptional Education, Gifted and Talented, and English as a Second Language. We have the largest ELL population in Henrico County. Students in 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades may begin taking courses for high school credit.

### FACULTY AND STAFF:

For the 2020-2021 school year, there are 90 faculty and staff serving approximately 1200 students. The administrative team consists of the principal, associate principal, assistant principal, and three administrative aides. The School Counseling department has four full-time school counselors and a registrar.

Honor roll reports are generated at the end of each marking period, each semester, and at the end of the year. Certain letter grades (D, F, U, S or P) exclude students from "Honor Roll" or "All A" reports. Letter grades of I or N are flagged for consideration at the school level.

### FEEDER PATTERN:

Elementary – Students come to Brookland from Chamberlayne, Dumbarton, Holladay, Johnson, Longdale, and Trevvett. Attendance zone determines which students from these schools attend Brookland.

High School – Students will attend Hermitage High School or Tucker High School. Attendance zone determines which high school students will attend. In addition, they have the option to apply to any Henrico County Public Schools Specialty Center, Maggie L. Walker Governor's School and/or CodeRVA Regional High School.
