

**P7-04-021 World Language Credits for Students Demonstrating Language Proficiency
New June, 2019**

Any student who demonstrates proficiency through a method acceptable to the Superintendent or designee may earn world language credits commensurate with performance or proficiency level as defined by the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages (ACTFL). For languages in which speaking or writing tests are not available, the Superintendent or designee will seek alternate tests or other ways for students to demonstrate their functional language proficiency. Credits will be awarded for students who demonstrate proficiency at the Novice High (1 credit), Intermediate Low (2 credits) or Intermediate Mid (3 credits) levels defined by ACTFL

Where available, tests from ACTFL will be used to test student proficiency in speaking and writing. The lower of the two scores will be used to determine the allocation of credits.
