## 2018-2019 SCHOOL PROFILE

### SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Quioccasin Middle School is located in the suburban west end of Henrico County. The school was built in 1971 on 35 acres.

### ACADEMIC SCHOOL CHARACTERISTICS:

Quioccasin Middle School operates on a modified block schedule. Students see each teacher on Mondays. Tuesday through Friday, students meet twice in each class for a longer period of time. Our ROAR class meets on Wednesdays and Fridays, allowing for more in-depth study, project-based learning, remediation and enrichment activities. A variety of courses are offered with different levels that allow for course credit. The day begins at 8:35 a.m. and ends at 3:15 p.m.

### FACULTY AND STAFF:

For the 2018-2019 school year, there are 80+ teachers serving over approximately 1,100 students. The administrative team consists of the principal, one associate principal, two assistant principals and three administrative aides. The School Counseling Department consists of three full-time counselors and a registrar.

There are two types of honor roll reports: All A, which requires a student to earn all course grades of "A" and Honor Roll, which requires a student to earn a "B" average in all courses taken. Honor roll reports are generated at the end of each marking period, each semester, and at the end of the year. Certain letter grades (D, F, U, S, or P) exclude students from "Honor Roll" or "All A" reports. Exploratory courses are not figured into any honor roll calculation nor are any .25 courses taken for one marking period only. Letter grades of I or N are flagged for consideration at the school level.
